

<u>Project Title:</u> Establishment of ASEAN Burden of Disease Network to Undertake Workshops on NCDs and Joint Research on Excess Deaths during COVID-19 Pandemic

General objective: To strengthen and facilitate the establishment of the ASEAN Burden of Disease Network for continuing activities and collaboration as agreed

Specific objectives:

- 1. To promote and strengthen networking of ASEAN BOD experts
- 2. To strengthen capacity of AMS to analyze SDG indicator 3.4.1 on premature mortality due to four NCDs, and to estimate YLD and YLL for top five risk factors including NCDs
- 3. To identify areas and develop proposals for joint research on excess deaths during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- To analyse and find solutions for strengthening essential data for BOD (deaths and morbidity)

 - Estimate excess death from COVID-19 pandemic;
 - Burden of disease NCDs and risk factors.
